Duration	Instructions
5	Round of names + country + who am I (teacher/mobility coordinator...) + one interesting fact
5-10	World map: participants stand in different parts of the room, representing the places they came from. In a second round they could stand in a place representing the country they spent most time abroad, or a country they would love to visit.
10-15	Group composition lines. Participants stand in structured lines according to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - How long they have travelled to get to the Summer School - How long they have been involved in their job - How many students they have supported in mobility experiences

	- How long was their longest stay abroad
10-15	Name game of choice, for example: Tic-Tac : a person standing in the middle of the circle points someone and says « tic » or « tac » (for « tic » they should say the name of the person on the left, for « tac » say the name of the person on the right, for « tic-tac » everyone changes places in the circle). When the response is wrong or too slow, the person in the middle of the circle changes.
10-15	« Me too ! » One person stands up and says « I am the only one who... », trying to say something they think is unique about them. If it applies to anyone else in the group, they say « Me too ! » and also stand up. Then the initial person needs to find something else. The round goes around the circle this way.
